Fundamental British Values underpin what it is to be a citizen in a modern and diverse Great Britain valuing our community and celebrating diversity of our country. The Government define extremism as vocal or active opposition to Fundamental British Values.

Democracy

As students you vote for a class representative to feedback concerns and ideas via Student Forums.

The rule of law

The College has a Code of Conduct which is fair and keeps the College community safe.

Individual liberty

Regular student voice activity and student satisfaction surveys allow students to share their opinions. As a college we value everyone's opinions and respond with actions whenever possible.

Mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs, and for those without faith

When staff and students speak we listen which shows respect. We all should be tolerant of different faiths and beliefs as everyone is different.

What you need to know

PREVENT

New College Durham has a responsibility placed on it by the Government to ensure that the College has processes in place to address the threat of terrorism and to safeguard against radicalisation.

The strategy, known as PREVENT is embedded as part of the College's safeguarding policies and procedures.

Key terminology

EXTREMISM

Vocal or active opposition to Fundamental British Values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

TERRORISM

A violent action that endangers a person's life other than that of the person committing the action, involves serious violence against a person, causes serious damage to property, creates a serious risk to the public's health and safety and interferes with or disrupts an electronic system.

RADICALISATION

A process by which an individual or group comes to adopt increasingly extreme political, social, or religious ideals and aspirations that reject or undermine the status quo or undermine contemporary ideas and expressions of freedom of choice.

IDEOLOGY

Is a set of opinions or beliefs of a group or an individual. Very often ideology refers to a set of political beliefs or a set of ideas that characterise a particular culture. Capitalism, communism, socialism, and Marxism are ideologies.

CHANNEL

Provides support across the country to those who may be vulnerable to being drawn into terrorism. The overall aim of the programme is early intervention and diverting people away from the risk they may face.
